Howdy North Texas Chapter friends,

The North Texas Chapter, NRHS is sponsoring a "**North Texas Rail Ramble**" on Saturday, April 12th, 2014, a group rail ride for the fun of it. We plan to ride the DCTA, DART, TRE and Amtrak's Heartland Flyer for a circle trip around DFW and North Texas.

Our trip will begin Saturday morning in Denton, Texas at 9:30am at the Downtown Denton Transit Center. Begin a circle trip of DFW via DCTA and DART to Dallas Union Station. Then TRE to Fort Worth's Intermodal Center, then board Amtrak's Heartland Flyer to Gainesville, TX. We then head back home via MotorCoach to Downtown Denton Transit Center by 8:00pm.

Cost: First part is on your own with a "DAY PASS" on DCTA, DART & TRE, then after lunch in Fort Worth, it's All Aboard Amtrak and a Coach Bus ride back to Denton. The cost for Amtrak and the Bus is only \$39.

This trip is open to anyone who likes to ride trains. Limited to only 30 people!

Activities include: Group trip pricing. Lots of photo ops along the way. Ride with friends and make new friends.



Chapter News and Views

President's Roundhouse – Railroad Trivia

- The **headlight**, a major feature of American locomotives, never caught on with British railroads. Railroads in the UK were required by law to fence in all tracks, eliminating the need for engineers to see far ahead of their trains.
- With **early wooden coaches**, a tumbling passenger car crash was a terrifying, and all too common, experience. Even more than the crash itself, injury and loss of life was caused by the heating stoves and oil lamps setting the car on fire.
- The **point on a switch** where the rails cross is called a "frog." It's named after a part of a horse's hoof that it closely resembles.
- Starting in 1875, railroad traffic was continuing to increase, necessitating more stops throughout the nation and more hungry railroad passengers. **Roadside restaurants** started springing up along the ATSF Railroad. They were nicknamed Harvey Houses.





• In the early days, railroad workers would link cars together by dropping a metal pin in between two cars to link them together. This was extremely dangerous, as the link had to be made while the cars were moving. This changed with the **knuckle coupler**, which would link together without needing someone to be in between the cars.

President Lincoln and the Transcontinental Railroad

In 1862, Congress passed and President Lincoln signed the act creating the Union Pacific Railroad and the transcontinental railroad. Apparently the act left it to the president to select the gauge for the railroad. Six months later President Lincoln made a proclamation as to the size of that gauge. Obviously the gauge was changed to standard gauge at some later time. Here is President's Lincoln's proclamation. It is interesting to consider that even in the middle of the Civil War President Lincoln still had other things on his agenda which he had to deal with. "Whereas by the twelfth section of an act of Congress entitled "An act to aid in the construction of a railroad and telegraph line from the Missouri River to the Pacific Ocean, and to secure to the Government the use of the same for postal, military, and other purposes," approved July 1, 1862, it is made the duty of the President of the United States to determine the uniform width of the track of the entire line of the said railroad and the branches of the same; and

Whereas application has been made to me by the Leavenworth, Pawnee and Western Railroad Company, a company authorized by the act of Congress above mentioned to construct a branch of said railroad, to fix the gauge thereof:

Now, therefore, I, Abraham Lincoln, President of the United States of America, do determine that the uniform width of the track of said railroad and all its branches which are provided for in the aforesaid act of Congress shall be 5 feet, and that this order be filed in the office of the Secretary of the Interior for the information and guidance of all concerned.

Done at the city of Washington, this 21st day of January, A.D. 1863.

Chapter Business Meeting Minutes, Mar. 3, 2014

NORTH TEXAS CHAPTER, NATIONAL RAILWAY HISTORICAL SOCIETY, MINUTES, DATE: March 3, 2014, SOKOL Hall, Dallas, Texas.

The membership meeting was held at SOKOL Hall in Dallas, TX. President Wayne Smith called the meeting to order at 7:30pm with 11 members and one guest in attendance.

Wayne reported the chapter board of directors had approved a \$1000 grant to the Red River Railroad Museum in Denison, TX to cover part of the costs of refurbishing their locomotive. We will present the check to them in late March or early April on an agreeable weekend so the members can visit the museum and partake in the photo-op.

VP Trips & Events Skip Waters reported the chapter will host a 'Rail Ramble' on Saturday, April 12, 2014 and presented a flyer outlining the day-long field trip. Participants will assemble in Denton and ride the 'A' train to Carrollton, transfer to the Dart 'Green Line' train to Victory Park, and transfer to the 'Red/Blue Line' to get to Dallas Union Station. From there they will ride the TRE to Ft. Worth, have a lunch break, then board the Amtrak Heartland Flyer and ride to Gainesville, TX where they will board a bus to ride back to Denton. Cost of the Amtrak ticket and bus ride is \$39 with members responsible for their own light rail day pass for \$10, \$2.50 if a senior. The trip is limited to 30 riders; participants must reserve seats with Skip by March 28 and send their \$39 payment to the chapter NLT April 4, 2014. Skip reported that Gerald Hook had helped him set up the 'Rail Ramble' and would also be in attendance at the event.

Skip presented the chapter with a check for \$520 as our share of the proceeds from the recently completed train show season of the N. TX Council and made a proposal to purchase an additional share in the coming season with the understanding that member Dave Podhrasky will work most of the additional hours the additional share will ensue, since his other club, Union Station Model RR Club will not be purchasing the two shares they have done in the past. Dave P. will work with the council to have the same hours he has worked in the past assigned to him again but have them accrue to our benefit instead. Skip made a motion to purchase the additional share, seconded by Dave Gramm. In discussion, Skip amended the motion to make it contingent on the council allowing Dave P. to transfer his hours. Amendment accepted and the motion passed.

Skip also reported the IMAX movie 'Rocky Mountain Express' is finishing up its engagement at the Omni Theatre in Ft. Worth and proposed a group viewing of the film this Sunday, March 8 at the 3:55pm showing. Any members interested should just show up at the theatre around 3:30pm. Tickets are on your own. In other regional news, Skip reported the Gulf Coast chapter is promoting a train trip from Houston to Lake Charles, Louisiana with a return by bus. While there, riders will visit the DeQuincy RR Museum. Tickets for the bus ride are \$30 and each rider must purchase their own Amtrak ticket. Contact the Gulf Coast chapter or Skip for more details. The Houston Railroad Museum has found a new home in Tomball, TX and will soon change its name.

Skip switched tracks and put his District 7 director hat on and gave an update on the NRHS national front. Longtime member Al Weber has submitted his name to run for president against incumbent Greg Molloy. Al is a member of the St. Louis chapter and is currently a District 6 director of the NRHS.





Our other District 7 director member **Claude Doane** sent his apologies for not being in attendance as he was ill with suspected food poisoning. Claude reported he will not be seeking re-election to the board as a District 7 director and we should look for a new candidate by the end of the month.

Jon reported that the April 1 meeting will also be held at SOKOL Hall and will feature a program on track laying by member Tim Massey to our meeting this month.) (Important note::There will be a meeting on 4-1-14, it's not an April fool's joke.)

Jon also reported on a recent antique post card show at the Southfork Hotel in Plano. He purchased several post cards depicting views of Dallas in the early 1900's with streetcar tracks visible in them. He also purchased several cards depicting the Interurban Building and three pictures of various trains including the Pikes Peak Cog Railway and a picture of the original summit building on top of the mountain before it was rebuilt.

Member Jimmy Barlow reported chapter treasurer Jim King has updated his railroad tower web page with new pictures and members should check it out.

Meeting adjourned at 8:15pm with program following. **Member Jerry Nunn** presented two programs he compiled, one showcasing railroad employees and titled 'Working on the Railroad' and a second one covering railcar graffiti named 'American Graffiti'.
