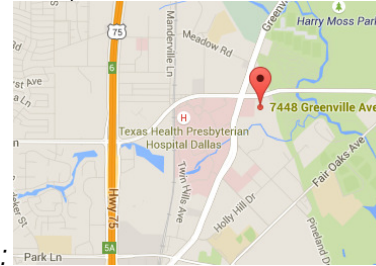

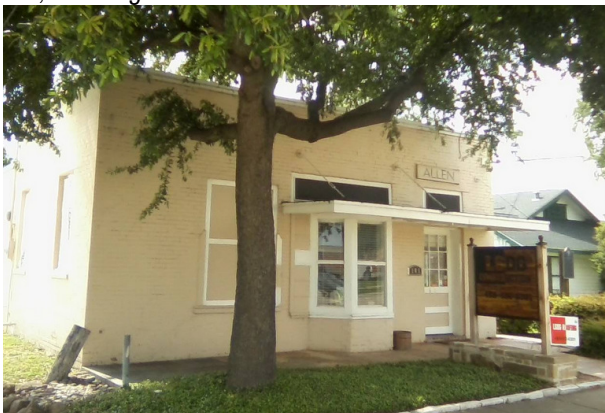

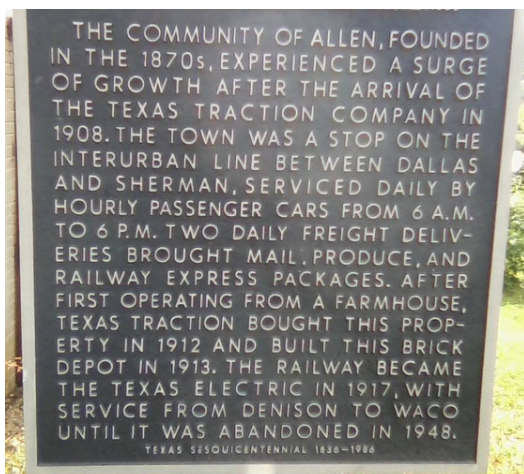

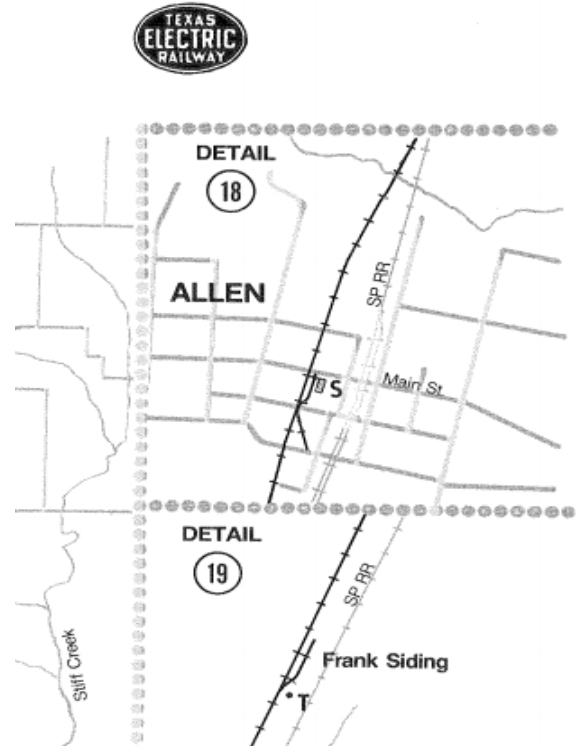


Top left: The Texas Electric Railway station, Allen, TX. (Photo credit: Jon Shea)

Chapter Business Meeting Minutes, June 2, 2015.

NORTH TEXAS CHAPTER, NATIONAL RAILWAY HISTORICAL SOCIETY, MINUTES, DATE: June 2, 2015. SOKOL Hall, Dallas, Texas...

President Wayne Smith called the meeting to order at 7:35pm. There were 11 chapter members present and guest chauffeur Carolyn Gramm, who brought her spouse, Secretary Dave Gramm since he is unable to drive a vehicle at this time.

Wayne welcomed all attendees and thanked those members in attendance that helped with the 10th Anniversary of "24 Hours @ Saginaw" event. There were 113 official signed in visitors plus numerous others who showed up without signing in. The chapter sold 8 books and raised over \$200 from the auction, thanks to members Skip Waters, Jon Shea and Bob Kennedy supplying most of the auction items. Jon Shea commented on the change of railroad cars seen at the Saginaw depot over the past 10 years. Skip commented the event was well attended and the presentations were very informative. He felt that whenever we have bona fide speakers, our attendance increases and that if the weather had been better we could have set a new attendance record.

VP-Trips & Events Skip Waters requested the chapter do a slide auction during the September Plano train show in order to earn an additional 5% return on our show shares. This is in addition to the regular slide/video presentation at the January train show. Attending members agreed to the request. Skip reported on the chapter's current book sales. This month's TRAINS magazine has a reprint of our book ad and the COWCATCHER is re-running our ad after a typo was found in the last issue. Over 200 copies have been sold so far even though we haven't actually promoted it yet. We currently have an order for 50 books from a California dealer.

On the National front, Skip reported the annual convention would be held in June in Vermont. Membership cards were sent out last week. There are still some problems with the new database but errors are being fixed. There will be several constitutional items to be voted on including term limits for the office of president.

Wayne reported that he had recently joined the 'Friends of the Cumbres & Toltec' historical group and passed around a brochure outlining membership opportunities.

VP-Programs Jon Shea reported on future meeting locations and programs. The July meeting will be held at the Garland Railroad Museum with the program being the viewing of the museum artifacts. The August meeting will be held at the Founder's Building in Grapevine with member Jerry Nunn providing a program on his latest photos as well as reports on the recently completed national convention in Vermont. The September meeting will also be held in Grapevine with member Skip Waters giving a program on the 'Crash at Crush' orchestrated train wreck. The October meeting location and program had not



been determined yet, but the November meeting will be in Grapevine with the program being the annual member's auction and the December meeting will be the annual Christmas party dinner at Babe's restaurant in Carrollton.

Member Jerry Nunn reported the Heartland Flyer is back running as of the previous evening. The torrential rains have wreaked havoc on the trackage and the track has been repaired enough to allow travel from Ft. Worth to Oklahoma City without having to bus around bad washouts.
